Competencia del curso

Listening

To understand routines in a job; to understand description of purchases, to understand what is said about the first boss; to understand cultural issues; to receive instructions; to comprehend feedback on mistakes; to receive information about a business idea.

Speaking

To show agreement and disagreement, to make requests, to give opinions, to add and contrast information, to make suggestions and objections; to give reasons, to correct oneself; to give surprising news, to take turns in a discussion; to make guesses; to express certainty, probability and possibility; to compliment; to say no tactfully; to deal with difficult conversations.

Reading

To understand short business texts such as emails and letters; to comprehend messages; to read charts; to get the gist of a text; to scan texts for information.

Writing

To write a personal profile, to write requests and responses in an e-mail; to write a marketing plan; to write a suggestion; to complete an application form; to write a message giving reasons and explanations; to write short reports; to write a letter of application.

Metodología

Our English as a second language courses correspond to the University's three distinctive elements: **Happiness, Tailored** Learning Experience and Experiential Learning.

The content is available on the technological platform (Blackboard) assuring the same standard quality, regardless of the place or campus in which the subject is being studied. The activities in each course are designed with the purpose of assuring the development of competences in the students by setting achievable learning outcomes.

Characteristics

The main characteristics of the courses are the following:

- Blended learning. Through different platforms and appropriate computer mediated-activities.
- **Correlation with the Common European Framework of References for Languages (CEFR).** Students completing a course should reach a level of language skill as described by the CEFR.
- **Grammar reference.** All topics include brief grammar explanations presented with a cross reference to further information and activities on different platforms.
- Vocabulary. American and British vocabulary is presented in all topics.
- Topic orientation. It is particularized to develop competences in the students.
- Activity design. It is elaborated with the purpose of assuring the development of competences by the generation of learning outcomes.

Approaches

• Four skill development approach

In order to provide a well-balanced development of the 4 language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing), this course includes per topic: practice activities, homework and self-activities.

• Communicative approach

Students use diverse communication strategies and real life English to build language and to produce meaningful communication. The role of the teacher will be a facilitator of learning and one of the main tasks is to provide the student with positive feedback. Some of these tasks are student-centered.

• Structural approach to cooperative learning

The activities are designed to positively engage students with the topics. In order to meet the requirements of these activities, student interaction and participation are vital in every activity.


