## Topics 1-2

Let the students be creative in the making process of their own Risk Model. Invite them to consider unusual variables, to "Think Different", out of the box. Creative variables is also a good attribute to consider for their evaluation.

Suggestions for the teaching professor: Encourage your students to engage in a political debate, with examples and arguments, using the four factors of the Packenham model. It is important that students do some current and relevant research of public affairs in each country.

### Suggestions for the teaching Professor:
